## **Student Learning – Coding in Our Learning Commons**

In January, we had a special guest visit Carlin's Library Learning Commons to help students learn about coding.

Jessa Clark, District Technology Helping Teacher, taught coding to all classes from kindergarten to grade 8 for three weeks through the library with Ms. Ellis. Students learned to code using Scratch Jr, Swift Playground, Ozobots (mini-robots), and Spheroes (sphere robots). Teachers could book Ms. Clark for more in-depth lessons at other times during the week.
